
Classified Learning Cooperative Program Overview

What is the Classified Learning Cooperative program?

The purpose of the Classified Learning Cooperative Program (CLC) is to offer non-restrictive learning opportunities that can be designed for individuals or small groups to acquire new skills, develop skills in a collaborative group, implement learning in the workplace, and reflect on the process.



How does it work?

Decide what you want to learn relevant to your job

Write a new proposal using the CLC Proposal form

or

Enroll in an existing course that has not started

Submit the proposal to the Professional Learning Coordinator: Tania Rowe at trowe@powayusd.com

PL Coordinator works with writer and Advisory Board Member to revise proposal if needed

Proposal is given final approval at monthly Professional Learning Advisory Board meeting

Course offering is posted on website and newsletter for interested participants to join

Sessions are conducted - attendance required

Participants completes and submits to Facilitatory all requirements outlined in the specific CLC

Facilitator submits portfolio, summary, roster and timesheet to Coordinator

Final paperwork is approved by PLAB and points are awarded

POINTS

5 points = approximately 20 hours of work 10 points = approximately 40 hours of work

- * Points will be awarded in increments of five (5). Partial points will not be allocated.
